Dr. Vincent Ho is a Mechanical Engineer by training and has over 35 years of experience in transportation, nuclear, aerospace, and defence industries specialising in risk management and system safety.

Dr. Ho is the Hon. Treasurer of the IMechE (Hong Kong Branch), where he served as the Chairman of the Special Projects Subcommittee and a Co-Opt member. He is the 52nd President of Institution of Occupational Safety and Health, the world's largest chartered health and safety professional organisation with over 48,000 members worldwide. Vincent chaired the Safety Specialists Committee; Mechanical, Marine, Naval Architecture and Chemical Division; and Nuclear Division of HKIE, where he also serves as a School Ambassador and an Assessor of the Mechanical Engineering Discipline.

Dr. Ho has served on various Hong Kong government boards and committees, including the Independent Police Complaints Council, Inland Revenue Board of Review, and various appeal and disciplinary boards of safety-related ordinances.

Prior to his retirement from the MTR Corporation, Vincent was the Head of Corporate Safety responsible for safety governance of all MTR railway and property businesses in Hong Kong, as well as in mainland China, Australia, Sweden, and UK.
